## ACCESS TO THE OUTDOOR MUST BE SEEN IN CONNECTION WITH:





### NOC OF DENMARK ENVIRONMENTAL HISTORY




- In 1983 NOC of Denmark established an Environmental Committee
- In 1993 a full-time staff position was added
- In 1997 an
   Environmental Code of
   Conduct was adopted
   by the General
   Assembly



### NOC OF DENMARK ENVIRONMENTAL HISTORY



- In 1998 an
   Environmental Award
   was established for 10
   years
- In 2008 the Environmental code of conduct was revised and became more directed
- In 2010 an
  Environmental
  Certification of
  National Sports
  Federations was
  introduced

- The National Federations
- The Clubs
- The individual athletes

- Seminars for volunteers
- Environmental Certification

### **GREEN FEDERATION**



In 2010 the NOC introduced a certification of environment to be applied by the National Sports Federations.



- 1. NSF's own environmental code
- 2. Initiatives towards the clubs
- 3. Recommendations for athletes
- 4. Political/employe contact
- 5. Encouragements to local work
- 6. Partaking in hearing statements
- 7. Special action every two year
